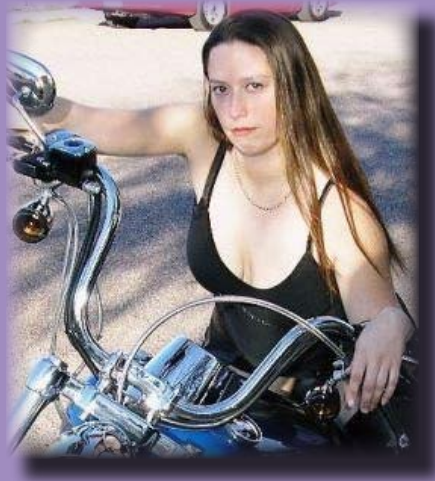


We all know the economy is looking pretty grim.

So now that a new bike is out of the question, why not fix up your old bike? Here are a couple of effective ways to dress up your bike inexpensively.

Brighten up your blinkers! - Colored LED's for front and rear blinkers can be as low as \$15.00 a pair. Put an LED in your taillight for another \$30.00, plus some clear or smoked lenses all around. Clear lenses can be found at \$5.00 each for the turn signals. A well lit bike for less than \$100.00!!

Give your bike a theme! Pegs, hand grips and accents you can get from a Kuryakyn dealer in a range of styles. From flames to zombies or other chrome and rubber accents. The popular ISO look comes in under \$220.00 for front and rear pegs, brake and shift pegs, and grips with the throttle boss.



Replace those aluminum covers with chrome! If your budget is a little more stretchy, you can replace those old raw engine covers. You can get a full set of outer primary, transmission side cover, cam cover, derby cover and inspection cover for less than \$440.00 for softails and less than \$480.00 for baggers from Drag Specialties.

There are many ways to make your older bike look great even if you are on a budget. A few other quick suggestions would be to get your seat recovered in a new style or color, swap out your cables for braided stainless steel, or put on a new air cleaner assembly.
